


TEST TIP

Not many people were there at 10 a.m. The same thing happened after 8 p.m. It declined a lot to 120 and 180 people at 9 p.m. and 10 p.m. respectively. Between 12 noon and 2 p.m. the number of people was stabilised at 300.
