الشرط Conditionals / if clause

Conditionals describe the result of something that might happen (in the present or future)

Kinds of conditionals

1- The zero conditional: describes what happens in general, (general truth)

Example: if you heat water to 100° degrees, it boils اذا سـخنت الحاء لدرجة 011° فإنه سيتبر

Rule:

If +present simple tense, present simple tense

If you heat water to 100 degrees, it boils

If clause main clause

2- The first conditional: used to talk about things which might, happen in the future

اذا درست سأن-ج-ح

Rule:

If + present simple tense, will infinitive

If it rains tomorrow, we will go to cinema

If clause main clause
