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Lecture: expressing cause and effect

- ❖ In this lesson, we're going to learn the meaning of both cause and effect and what are the connective words needed to express them.
 - ✓ A Cause: is the event that happens first, is something that makes something else happen (the reason).
 - ✓ An effect: is what happens as a result of the cause (the result).
 - ➤ There is also what we call **cause and effect relationship** that means that whenever there is **a cause**, there is an also **an effect**, and whenever there is **an effect**, there is also **a cause**.
- ❖ To determine the cause , you must ask the question : « why did it happen ? ».
- ❖ To determine the effect you must ask the question : « what happened ? »
 - To express cause and effect in english, we use connector words or phrases such as: due to, because of, owing to, thanks to, as a consequence of, as a result of, because, since, as, for and they will either be follwed by a noun or a verb

Those followed by a noun are :	Those followed by a verb are :
Due to	because
because of	since
Owing to	as
As a consequence of	for
As a result of	
Thanks to	

- The structure of the cause/effect followed by a noun or noun phrase :
- ✓ Connector word or phrase + cause + effect.
- ✓ Effect + connector word/ phrase + cause
- Example:
 - > Due to sam laziness, he did not pass the english test.
- Connector word : due to
- Cause : sam laziness
- Effect : he did not pass the english test
 - ➤ The structue of the cause/effect followed by a subject+ verb or verb phrase :
- ✓ Connector word/ phrase + cause + effect
- ✓ Effect+ connector word/phrase + cause

Example:

Because sam was lazy, he didn't pass the english exam.

Connector word : because

Cause: sam was lazy

Effect: he didn't pass the english exam.

Note that: the cause might be written in the second part of the sentence, even though always happens first.
