## **Comparative of Equality and Inferiority**

## 1. Comparatives of equality:

- **A.** Comparative of positive equality: When we compare two subjects that are equal, we use S1+ is/am/are + as + adjective + as S2.
- E.g. **a-** Your house is big.

**b-**Your neighbor's house is big too.

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→Your house is as big as your neighbor's house.

**E.g.** This exercise is as difficult as the one we did yesterday.

- A. Comparative of negative equality (inequality): When we compare two subjects that are not equal we S1+ is/am/are + not as + adjective + as S2.
- E.g. **a-** The Thames is large

**b-** The Nile not large.

- → The Thames is not as/so long as the Nile. (= The Nile is longer than the Thames).
- 2. Comparatives of inferiority: When we compare two subjects that are not equal and one is inferior to another, we use less + adjective + than with all adjectives.

**E.g. a-** A sandwich costs 300DA in a restaurant.

**b-**A meal costs 1000DA in

- a restaurant.
- → A sandwich is less expensive than a meal in a restaurant.
- 3. Comparative of superiority: When we compare two subjects that are not equal and one is superior to another, we use more + adjective + than with all adjectives.

**E.g. a-** A sandwich costs 300DA in a restaurant.

**b-**A meal costs

1000DA in a restaurant.

→ A sandwich is more expensive than a meal in a restaurant.
