# Reported Speech (Indirect speech)

What is reported speech?

**Reported speech:** is when you tell somebody else what you or person said before.

# A. Reporting Statements:

- When transforming statements, check whether you have to change: pronouns, tense, place and time expression.

**1-Pronouns**: In reported speech, you often have to change the pronoun depending on who says what **.Example**: She says, "**My** dad likes roast chicken." – She says that **her** dad likes roast chicken.

**2-Tenses: a.** If the sentence starts in the **present**; there is **no backshift** of tenses in reported speech.

B. If these ntences tarts in the past; there is often backshift of tenses in reported speech.

**No backshift:** Do not change the tense if the introductory clause is in a present tense (e. g. <u>*He* says</u>). Example: He <u>says</u>, "I <u>write</u> poems." – He <u>says</u> that he <u>writes</u> poems.

**Backshift:** You must change the tense if the introductory clause is in a past tense (e. <u>g. *He*</u> <u>said</u>).Example: He<u>said</u>, "I <u>am</u> rich." – He <u>said</u> that he <u>was</u> rich.

#### **Examples of the main changes in tense:**

-The modal verbs *could, should, would, might, needn't, ought to, and used to* do not change. Example: He said, "She **might** be right." – He said that she **might** be right.

# Other modal verbs may change:

Model	Direct speech	Reported speech
Can	"I <b>can</b> do it."	He said he <b>could</b> do it
May	" <b>May</b> I go out?"	He wanted to know if he <b>might</b> go out.
Must	"She must apply for the job."	Hesaidthatshemust/had to applyforthejob.
Will	"They will call you."	He told her that they <b>would</b> call her.

#### 3- Place, demonstratives and time expressions

In the following table, you will find the different changes of time expressions; demonstratives and place.

# **B. Reporting Questions**: also note that you have to:

#### • transform **the question** into an **indirect question**

• use the question word (*where, when, what, how*) or *if / whether* 

<b>Types of questions</b>	Direct speech	Reported speech

#### **C.Reporting requests / commands and negative requests:**

Direct speech	Reported speech
"Nancy, do the exercice."	He told Nancy to do the exercise.
She said ,"don't be lazy"	She me asked not to be lazy
"Nancy,givemeyourpen,please."	He asked Nancy to give him her pen.

# **D.** Other transformations :

- Expressions of advice with **must**, **should** and **ought** are usually reported using *advise / urge*. Example: "You **must** read this book ."He **advised / urged** me to read that book.
- The expression **let's** is usually reported using *suggest*. In this case, there are two possibilities for reported speech: gerund or statement with *should*.

#### • Example:

"Let's go to the cinema." 1. He **suggested going** to the cinema.

2. He **suggested** that we **should** go to the cinema.
