Quantifiers

A quantifier is a word or phrase that indicates the quantity or amount of something. 'Some', 'many', 'a lot of' and 'a few', much, little, a little ... are examples of quantifiers.

Quantifiers can be used with both countable and uncountable nouns.

Countable nouns are nouns that can be counted and have a singular and plural

form. For example, "cat "is a countable noun. We can say "one cat" or" two

cats" .Uncountable nouns, on the other hand, cannot be counted and do not

have a plural form. For example, "water "is an uncountable noun . We cannot

say "one water " or "two waters" .Instead , we use words like " some" or "a

bottle of' to talk about quantities of uncountable nouns

Examples:

There are *some* books on the deskHe's got only *a few* dollars. How *much* money have you got? There is *a large quantity of* fish in this river.He's got *more* friends than his sister.

NOTE: little, very little mean that there is not enough of something. A little means that there is not a lot of something, but there is enough.

Few, very few mean that there is not enough of something.

A few means that there is not a lot of something, but there is enough.
