



## **bilabial**

- Bilabials or Bilabial consonants are a type of sound that are made with both lips (bilabial) and by partially stopping the air coming from the mouth when the sound is pronounced (consonant).

For example, [p] is bilabial, but [f] is not.



## **Bilingual**

## **Lingual**

- Jargon is occupation-specific language used by people in a given profession, the "shorthand" that people in the same profession use to communicate with each other.

Jargon, also referred to as "technical language", is "the technical terminology or characteristic idiom of a special activity or group".



- Speech and language problems differ, but often overlap. For example:
- A child with a language delay might say words well but only be able to put two words together.
- A child with a speech delay might use words and phrases to express ideas but be hard to understand.
