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The Active and Passive Voice

When do we use passive voice?

- -When we are more interested in the action than the person who does the action.
- -When it is not necessary to mention the doer of the action as it is clear who he is.
- -When we don't know or have forgotten who did the action.

Eg: The teacher **explained** the lesson. subject verb object The lesson was explained by the teacher. subject new structure preposition agent

Changes:

- 1) The object of the active becomes the subject in the passive.
- 2) The subject of the active becomes the agent in the passive; it is proceded by the preposition "by".
- 3) A new structure of the verb by putting the verb "to be" in the same tense as the active verb and adding the past participle of the active verb).

1) No object no passive.

Eg: My father works in hospital
Subject verb

<u>He is</u> intelligent subject verb

2) "by + agent" is omitted when it adds nothing to the meaning of the sentence.

Eg: Someone killed John Kennedy ____ John Kennedy was killed. subject verb object subject verb

3) When dealing with materials we put "with" rather than "by":

Eg: Clouds were covering the sky — The sky was being covered with clouds.

4) The subject pronoun in active voice becomes an object pronoun in passive voice:
